Declaration of Lead Agency Status for the Adoption of the Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment Zoning Amendment by the Village of Union Springs.

DECLARATION OF LEAD AGENCY STATUS FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE ELECTRIC VEHICLE SUPPLY EQUIPMENT ZONING AMENDMENT BY THE VILLAGE OF UNION SPRINGS

WHEREAS, the Village of Union Springs, with assistance from the Cayuga County Department of Planning and Economic Development, drafted an amendment to the Village Zoning Law pertaining to a new section on Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Union Springs, in considering adoption of a section of Zoning Law pertaining to Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment, is required to comply with the requirements of Article 8 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law, known as the State Environmental Quality Review Act, and regulations at 6 NYCRR Part 617 adopted thereunder (collectively, "SEQRA"); and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment section of the Zoning Law is a Type I Action under SEQRA which requires the preparation a Full Environmental Assessment Form ("Full EAF") and a coordinated environmental review among all Involved Agencies; and

WHEREAS, SEQRA requires that a Lead Agency be designated to coordinate among Involved Agencies and conduct the environmental review; and that for the adoption of the Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment sections of the Zoning Law the Village of Union Springs is the only Involved Agency; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with sections 239-I and 239-m of the New York State General Municipal Law, the Village referred the Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment section of Zoning Law to Cayuga County for review of countywide or intermunicipal impacts, to be held on or about March 17, 2016; now therefore, be it

Resolution Regarding Boat Launch Fees

WHEREAS, pursuant to Local Law 3 of 2016, the Union Springs Village Board of Trustees shall establish fees and fines for launching boats at Frontenac Park, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has declared itself to be "lead agency" for SEQRA purposes, determines this to be a Type II action with no effect on the environment, and therefore no environmental review will be undertaken,

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved:

- Individual launches. The Launch Fee for launching each boat shall be \$5The Fee shall cover launch, parking, and retrieval.
- 2. Fishing Tournaments.
- b. Fishing Tournaments registered with the Village of 3-25 or more boats will be charged a group rate of \$55 .00 to cover Launch Fees for all boats in the tournament. \$50 .00 to cover Launch Fees for all continuous to the continuous form.
